**Mrs Gadsby's response:**

Mrs Gadsby realises that not all children will really like school, but she and the staff want to make the school the best possible place for everyone and certainly a place where children are happy. It was interesting that in only 2 classes less children said they enjoyed learning and school so this could have been caused by a wish to comply, not appear uncool in front of friends etc. However, this will be followed up.

It is very pleasing that all children feel they are listened to and most feel able to find an adult when worried. Staff will emphasise how children can talk to an adult or if unable to for any reason, can use the worry box.

Staff are aware of individual children who have influenced the comments about behaviour and bullying and these children are monitored and are on specific programmes of support. The class teacher addressed the comments about bullying (see above) but this will be revisited frequently with all children through the PSHE curriculum and Anti-bullying week.

The few children who said they didn't feel safe will be supported: a SEND pupil will be supported by staff as the child has requested.

The other requests will be considered and actioned. Children will be reassured that the badgers will not harm anyone.

It is good to see that 70% of children have taken part in activities outside daily lessons. Many KS1 pupils may not have had an opportunity yet ( or haven't remembered that they have).

The reasons for not recommending Stokes Wood to other children were interesting 😊 but common sense from the children's point of view.
