

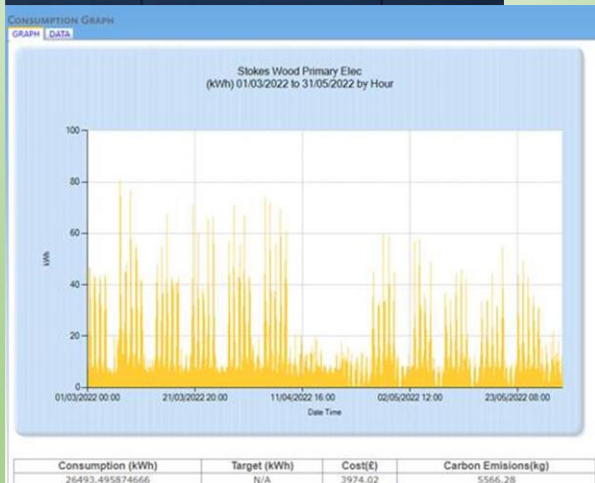

We have been generating a lot more solar energy since the installation of the inverters for the new solar panels in the Easter Holidays. We have been using a lot less electricity since Easter because of this. See the chart below showing our electricity usage before and after Easter holidays.

In the past month we have generated a total of 2575kwh of solar energy from our solar panel array. That is equivalent to saving 600kg of CO2 emissions from being released into the atmosphere.
