RECYCLE RIGHT

Sometimes, after we eat our snacks or open our toys, we have empty boxes and wrappers left.

What should we do with them?



The best thing is to have fewer empty boxes and wrappers. We can do this by picking toys and snacks that don't have too much packaging. If we can, we should use the boxes and wrappers again for fun crafts or storage. But if we can't use them again, we should put them in the right bin to help our planet.

It is called **RECYCLING**.

Putting things in the right bin can be a bit tricky because there are so many different bins. But guess what? Today, you're going to play a fun game! Imagine you're a football star, and you're going to kick the empty boxes and wrappers into the right bin to score!

RECYCLE RIGHT

Let's learn a bit about what we can put in each bin.

★ Metal Bin

You know the bin that has cans or food tins in it? Or cans of fizzy pop? These are made of metal. So after we've eaten or drunk, we can take our cans to the can bin and put it in the metal bin.

★ Plastic Bin

Some things are made of plastic. Your juice bottles, milk cartons, and some toys and games are made of plastic. So after we've used them, they're a bit messy, but we can put them in the plastic bin. Remember to empty and rinse them before putting them in the plastic bin.



★ Glass Bin

Glass is what some bottles and jars are made of. They're used for drinks. After using, they can be broken up to help you make them into all kinds of things in the glass bin.

RECYCLE RIGHT

★ Paper Bin

Paper is what we draw and write on. Old newspapers, magazines and some boxes are made of paper. Cardboard counts as paper too, that's the stuff your cereal boxes are made of and a lot of your parcel deliveries come in. If you remember it well, it's probably paper. Put these in the paper bin.

★ Food Waste Bin

Things like leftover fruits, veggies and even eggshells go in this bin. But don't put meat or dairy in there. These turn back into soil after some time, which is good to grow even more food!



★ Other Bin

If you're not sure where something goes, or if it doesn't fit in any of the bins above, it probably belongs in the "other" bin. But remember, we want to put as little in there as possible.
