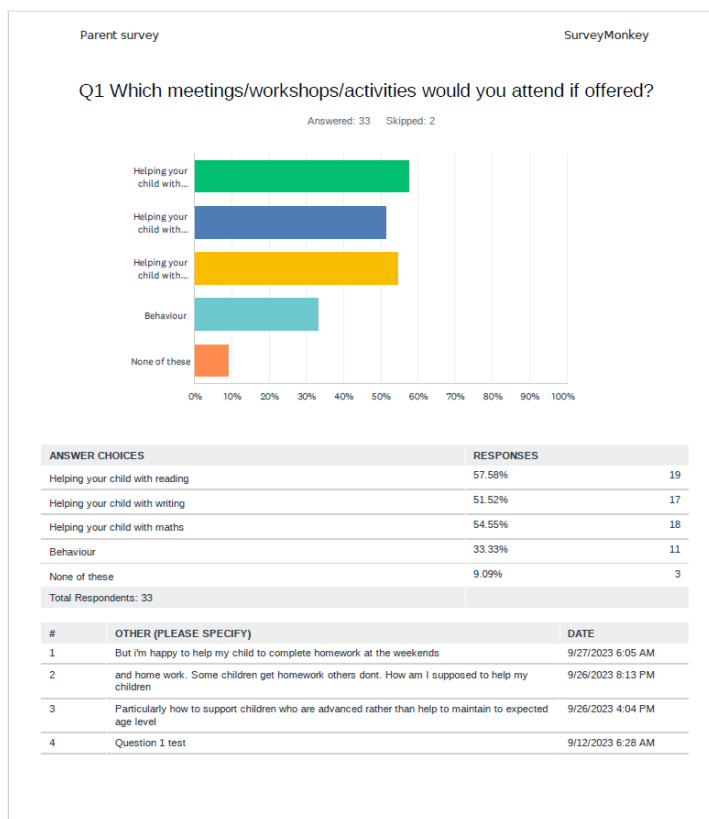


Parent survey Stokes Wood specific questions for our school.

Mrs Ciftci will be organising some reading workshop sessions for parents who would like to help their children at home with their reading with some coffee and cake, I 'm sure 😊.

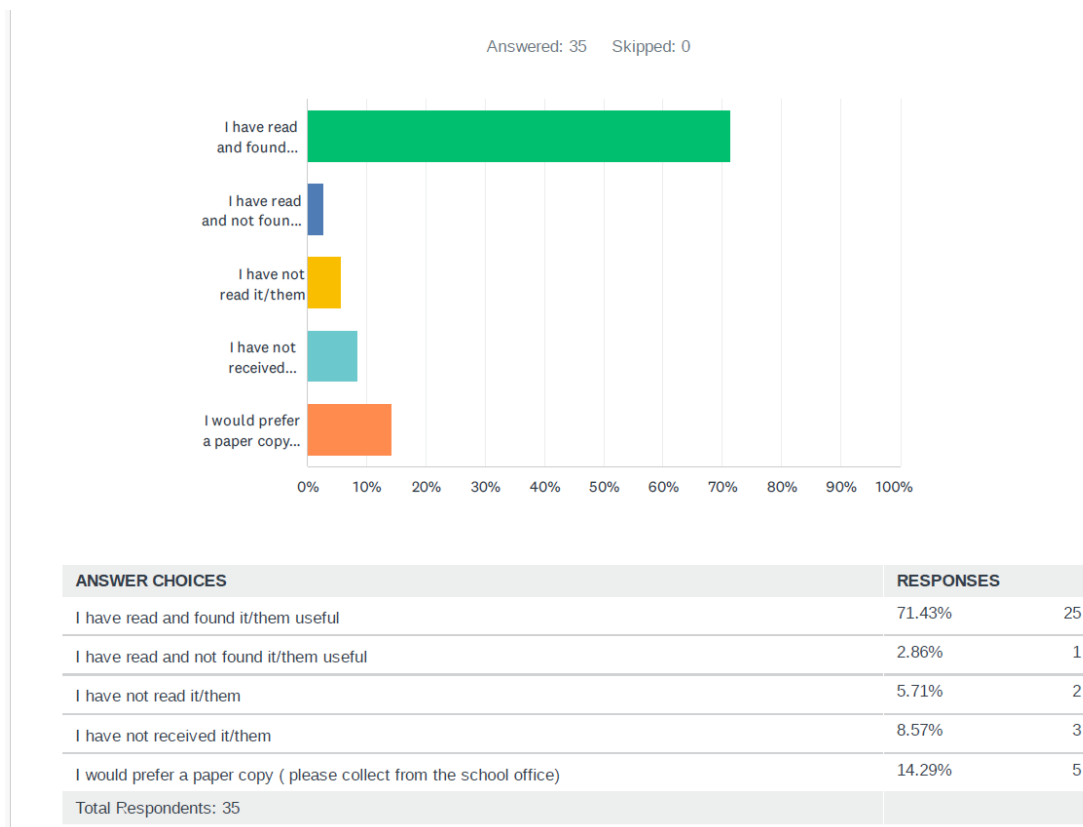
Practising handwriting and spellings will always help your child become a better writer. Reading and using their phonics also helps with writing. So, attending the reading workshop will also help you support your child with writing.

Mrs Edwards will be organising some maths workshop sessions for parents who would like to help their child at home. Practising table facts and general mental maths at home is always helpful too.

If your child brings home the maths skills activity, the answer sheets take you through how to explain the strategy to solve each question.

If you have any other questions about how to help your child (homework and challenging higher achievers for example), please ask your child's class teacher.

Q2All parents have received either or both: KS1 handbook/KS2handbook/Reception prospectus/nursery prospectus . Have you read the documents?



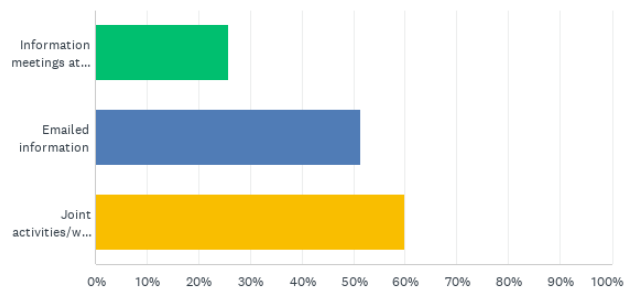
Mrs Gadsby's response:

Mrs Gadsby's response:

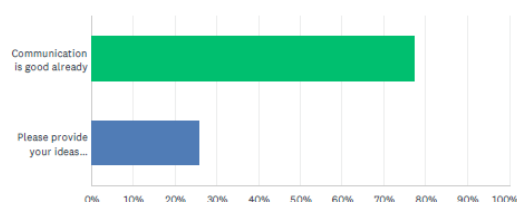
Last year we held some information meetings on Zoom which were only attended by 2 or 3 parents.
